# DISABILITY ACTION PLAN

Many complex issues, suggestions for practical solutions and smart actions have so far been identified during the consultation phase of the development of a new Central Goldfields Disability Action Plan.

An Advisory Committee has quickly helped to narrow the focus and identify specific recommendations for new infrastructure, and also for promoting for inclusion in employment, sport and the arts in the Shire.

The Action Plan will have a four-year life from early 2021 and as it is being implemented, there will be a further opportunity for community involvement through a Monitoring Committee.

The Advisory Committee, with representation from people living with disability, carers and key staff at disability service providers and the Maryborough District Health Service, has been meeting over the past month.

Their input has greatly extended the scope for improvements already identified by Council staff, which conducted thought provoking disability advocacy awareness sessions, evaluating services and infrastructure during the Local Government Caretaker Period ahead of the Council elections.

This included practical solutions such as ensuring picnic tables are wheelchair-accessible – and also some more complex problems such as learner drivers not wanting to disclose medical conditions that may stop them from getting a licence.

## CURRENT RESTRICTIONS

#### At the time of going to print Victoria was in COVIDSafe

Although restrictions have eased we must continue to:

- **Be vigilant:** Stay safe by washing your hands regularly, coughing and sneezing into your elbow, keeping at least 1.5 metres from others and staying home if you feel unwell.
- You must carry a face mask with you when you leave home: Wearing a face mask is only mandatory on public transport, while in taxis or ride share vehicles, or when going to large retail venues, including shopping centres, supermarkets and department stores. Wearing a face mask is strongly recommended indoors and outdoors when you can't keep 1.5 metres distance from other people.
- Get tested: If you have any COVID-19 symptoms, no matter how mild, you must get tested. Symptoms include: 

   Cough or sore throat
   Fever, chills or sweats
   Shortness of breath
   Runny nose
   Loss of sense of smell or taste.

You can make an appointment to get tested at Maryborough District Health Service by calling the Fever Clinic on 5461 0362.

Remember – you must stay home and isolate whilst you await your test results.

# **CURRENT PROJECTS** CAPITAL WORKS

## CARISBROOK FLOOD LEVEE - STAGE 3

- **Project schedule:** Complete
- Contractor name: Doran Earthmoving Pty Ltd.

Construction of Stage 3 of the Carisbrook Levee commenced in October, 2020 with the project now complete.

Local company Doran Earthmoving Pty Ltd delivered the project which included the construction of the Levee being the section of Pleasant Street from the Pyrenees Highway to the railway line and High Street from the railway line to Church Street.

The works involved building up, and constructing a sealed road and associated open drainage works. The works associated with the railway line and Pyrenees Highway culverts will be undertaken in the future stage.

The levee project has been designed in response to major floods which occurred in 2010 and 2011.

## CENTRAL GOLDFIELDS ART GALLERY – PHASE 1 REDEVELOPMENT

- **Project value:** \$500,00 from Regional Infrastructure Fund and \$273,000 from Council
- Project schedule: Commencing in July, 2021
- Completion Date: 31 March, 2022.

Identified as a transformational project in the Tourism & Events Strategy 2020-2025, the redevelopment of the Central Goldfields Art Gallery will deliver:

- Redevelopment of the entrance to the building, with the addition of floor to ceiling glass windows/doors set directly behind the metal fire doors
- Creation of an open, contemporary reception and retail area and the removal of false ceilings to reveal the original 19th century beams
- Environmental improvements including air conditioning and lighting to major gallery standards
- Improving the linear metres of hanging space available to exhibit works
- Improve accessibility throughout the gallery
- The addition of two new water closets, including one for people using a wheelchair and those requiring nappy changing facilities.

## **DUNOLLY LIBRARY**

- Project value: \$140,000 made possible by State Government funding – Living Libraries Grant announced in December 2019
- Project schedule: Due for completion January, 2021
- **Contractor name:** FNG Group Pty Ltd.

The former Police station building in Dunolly – located in the Dunolly Courthouse precinct on Market Street – is being refurbished to become the new Dunolly library facility.

The project is being undertaken by FNG Group Pty Ltd and involves the re-stumping of the existing building and the construction of an accessible toilet, ramp, new shelving, fresh paint and new carpet. The new site will also feature air-conditioning.

The new facility will replace the current visiting Outreach Van service that is offered by our Maryborough Regional Library team. The new static facility will feature a larger collection of resources, services and activities as well as an increase in opening hours making it more accessible to the community. It will also offer a public access computer, free WIFI and additional children's programming.

The Dunolly Library will commence operation early 2021.



## ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGE POINT

- **Project value:** \$664,000 total for 20-24 charge points in 12 local councils (funded by the Victorian Government)
- Project schedule: Complete.

Council is a member of the Central Victorian Greenhouse Alliance (CVGA), which is working in partnership with 12 local councils in our region and the Victorian Government to roll out a network of public EV charging infrastructure.

The CVGA received funding under the State Government's stimulus package to address the Electric Vehicle charging station gaps identified in its Charging the Regions Case Study project.

The funding is fast tracking investment in key towns, including Maryborough, to ensure there is a dense network of charging stations in the Loddon Campaspe and Mallee region.

The Charge Point has been installed outside the Community Hub, in close proximity to the Nolan Street offices which will also facilitate an uptake of electric vehicles within Council's fleet and will be highly visible to members of the community visiting the Hub, playground and Station Domain area. With the Visitor Information Centre soon to be relocated to the station building, travellers stopping to charge their batteries will be encouraged to come into the station for a coffee and discover what else is on offer in the region.

## MARYBOROUGH ENERGY BREAKTHROUGH ENHANCEMENT PROJECT

- Project value: \$1.5 million from State Government
- Project schedule: Underway
- Completion Date: 30 November, 2022.

The Maryborough Energy Breakthrough Project will encompass a range of enhancements to the festival site, racing conditions and the visitor experience including:

- Expanded scope and technology focus
- Enhanced spectator experience
- Improved camping facilities
- Increased interactivity
- Improved safety.

Phase-2 of the project will broaden the reach of the event, attracting new start-ups and established technology and utilities companies to create a world-class future-skills focused STEM Expo as part of the event.

## MARYBOROUGH RAILWAY STATION ACTIVATION PROJECT

- Project value: \$127,500 \$50,000 from the State Government's Stronger Regional Communities Program, \$67,500 from Council and \$10,000 in-kind contribution from the Committee for Maryborough
- Project schedule: To commence early 2021.

The first stage of the Maryborough Railway Station activation project will see the relocation of the town's Visitor Information Centre.

The Maryborough Railway Station Activation project is a key priority identified in both the Economic Development and Tourism and Events Strategies that were adopted in March, 2020. It has been supported by the Economic Response and Recovery Taskforce as a key element in local economic recovery as we emerge from the pandemic.

The overall vision is to see the station building become a hub of activity and provide a welcoming entry point to visitors to the Central Goldfields Shire.

The funding will enable some initial works to get this first stage of the project off the ground in 2020-21, while Council develops a long term masterplan that will enable this heritage building to once again become a hive of activity.

## TALBOT/AVOCA ROAD UPGRADE

The Talbot/Avoca Road upgrade was completed in October, 2020.

The major upgrade included a full reconstruction, including a culvert renewal, of a one kilometre stretch either side of the Amherst Cemetery.

The \$693,000 project was jointly funded by the Victorian Government's Fixing Country Roads Program (\$462,000) and Council (\$231,000).



## TOWNSHIP INFRASTRUCTURE UPGRADES

In 2019-2020 we had more than 1,035 conversations with our community as part of the Your Community 2030 project – funded as part of the Australian Government Building Better Regions Fund – which culminated in eight, ten year community plans for the townships of Maryborough, Bealiba, Carisbrook, Dunolly, Talbot, Majorca, Bet Bet and Timor.

Investment in our community hall facilities was a key theme of each of the plans.

Thanks to funding as part of the Australian Government Local Road & Community Infrastructure Program, the following improvement works will be delivered:

#### **Bealiba & District**

- Shade sails & improvements to the playground
- Bealiba Hall improvement including upgrading of kitchen

#### **Bet Bet & District**

- Improvement works at the Betley Mechanics Institute Hall including BBQ shelter & seating
- Upgrade of signage for Bet Bet & district
- Tree planting

#### **Dunolly & District**

- Improvements to town signage
- Shade sails Dunolly swimming pool
- Tree planting within Dunolly
- Playground improvements

#### **Majorca & District**

- Shade sails & improvements to the playground
- Tree planting within Majorca
- Hall improvement works including repainting internal & external of the building

#### **Timor & District**

- Timor/Bowenvale & Wareek Hall improvements including Install air conditioning & painting improvement works
- Shade sails & improvements to the playground
- Tree planting.

The 'Green The Street' initiative is being rolled out in High Street and Nolan Street in Maryborough – in response to feedback we received from the local business community.

'Green The Street' focuses on creating a visually pleasing streetscape that all members of the community can be proud of and want to spend time in.

As part of the project our Open Space team have refreshed existing garden beds with climate suitable plants in Alma and High Streets.





154 botanical labels have been installed at the Phillips Gardens in Maryborough recently by our Parks and Gardens team.

The botanical labels are now in place on all trees and significant plants and feature the common name, botanic name, country of origin and species.

The labels were made possible thanks to a \$20,000 State Government Growing Victoria Botanic Gardens grant that also funded the planting of a number of advanced trees at the Gardens earlier in the year.

## LET THERE BE LIGHT!

We have been successful in securing \$150,095 in State Government funding for the lighting of Lake Victoria in Maryborough.

The project will include the replacement of existing lights with energy efficient LED lighting as well as the installation of an additional 10 new lights.





## Stay aware of the Fire Danger Rating and know what to do.

The Fire Danger Rating predicts how a fire would behave if one started, including how difficult it would be to put out. The higher the rating, the more dangerous the conditions. The rating is your trigger to act, so to stay safe you need to stay aware of the Fire Danger Rating in your district. During the Fire season, the Fire Danger Rating will feature in weather forecasts, be broadcast on radio and TV and appear in some newspapers. It can also be found on the of CFA and VicEmergency websites or by calling the VicEmergency Hotline **1800 226 226** 

CODE RED	WHAT DOES IT MEAN? These are the worst conditions for a bush or grass fire. Homes are not designed or constructed to withstand fires in these conditions. The safest place to be is away from high risk bushfire areas.	WHAT SHOULD I DO? Leaving high risk bushfire areas the night before or early in the day is your safest option – do not wait and see. Avoid forested areas, thick bush and long, dry grass. Know your trigger – make a decision about: – when you will leave – where you will gea – how you will get there – when you will return – what you will do if you cannot leave
EXTREME	Expect extremely hot, dry and windy conditions. If a fire starts and takes hold, it will be uncontrollable, unpredictable and fast moving. Spot fires will start, move quickly and will come from many directions. Homes that are situated and constructed or modified to withstand a bushfire, that are well prepared and actively defended, may provide safety.
