ECONOMIC RESPONSE & RECOVERY

BUILDING A STRONG ECONOMIC FUTURE FOR CENTRAL GOLDFIELDS

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The COVID-19 pandemic has challenged us all and none more than our local business community.

Since the pandemic hit in March we've worked to support our local economy through the delivery of a range of response and recovery actions.

A list of our immediate actions are provided below and on the next page we explore the next stage of projects we're working to deliver to ensure a strong economic future for the Central Goldfields.



WHAT WE'VE BEEN WORKING ON TO DATE

Economic Response and Recovery Taskforce

10 local business representatives from a range of sectors, working with us to report on local impacts and how to respond. Outcomes have included:

- Identified high priority actions from Economic Development and Tourism & Events Strategies
- Advocacy to Council for targeted financial relief for hard-hit local businesses, and extended support beyond September
- Advocacy to Dr Ann Webster MP for federal support measures to be extended
- Advocacy to Bendigo Regional Tourism Board for a greater share of state funds to support local tourism

WHERE TO FROM HERE?

Economic recovery is a major priority and the following actions are some of the ways we are working to build a strong economic future for the Central Goldfields Shire.



Capital Works Program

The 2020/21 Council Budget features a \$15.9 million capital works program to help stimulate our local economy. This program was made possible thanks to \$9.5 million secured funding from the Federal and State governments. This will support local businesses and jobs during the works phase and provide lasting community infrastructure.

The projects include:

- Maryborough Outdoor Pool upgrade \$2 million
- Community halls and facilities improvements \$565,000
- Talbot Town Hall toilet upgrade \$250,000
- Energy Breakthrough infrastructure upgrades \$500,000 (\$1.5 million over three years)
- Central Goldfields Art Gallery redevelopment \$675,000
- Maryborough Skate and Scooter Park \$645,000
- Carisbrook Recreation Reserve upgrade \$4 million
- Worsley Cottage repairs \$150,000
- Carisbrook Scout Hall and Lions Club roof repairs \$10,000
- Maryborough Community House carpark lighting and disability access \$10,000
- New footpaths in Bealiba, Carisbrook, Talbot and Dunolly \$81,000

Montoya Turner's smile (pictured) warmed everyone's hearts when she took the first swing on the 'Liberty Swing' at Maryborough's Princes Park in 2018. Her smile embodies the changes Central Goldfields wants to see in our community for those living with disability:

- Reducing barriers for access to goods, services and facilities
- Reducing barriers to getting and keeping a job
- Promoting inclusion and community participation
- Tangible changes in attitudes and practices that discriminate

The Central Goldfields Shire Disability Action Plan is committed to delivering these four outcome areas under the Disability Act 2006, as well as asking about the impacts of the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and COVID-19 virus.

A Steering Group including a person living with disability, a carer, disability service providers, as well as Council staff, will guide the development of the Plan.

COMMUNITY CULTURE AND DIVERSITY

Georgia MacGuire is a Wurundjeri woman who has been an active member in the Central Goldfields community since 2013 and is working with Council and Dja Dja Wurrung traditional owners to develop a Reconciliation Action Plan.

This will create more opportunities to develop and strengthen Council's capability to represent, advocate for and support local Dja Dja Wurrung and other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the region.

Local knowledge is important to this process and Council is committed to working with local community. Council will be looking at more innovative ways to collaborate to provide greater access to services, employment, economic, and career development opportunities for all.

Georgia has been a practicing visual artist for 10 years and has previously worked in the community sector with children, young people and families for more than 20 years.
