MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Autumn is a special time to spend in the Central Goldfields Shire whether as residents or visitors. It's also a time when so many things are happening. We have had some very exciting recent developments which add to our long list of core attractions.

Council was thrilled to be allocated \$1.2 million in additional funding from the Victorian Government for phases 2 and 3 of the Central Goldfields Art Gallery's revitalisation project. We are excited at the increased exhibition space in an already very special place and the increase to the variety of exhibitions we will be able to present.

Council was also delighted to award a \$605,000 tender for a Skate and Scooter Park to be built along in Princes Park near Lake Victoria and the adventure playground and barbecue area. The project has been made possible through Victorian Government and Council funding.

There are a range of projects taking place in Carisbrook, Dunolly, Talbot and Bealiba and other smaller locations to upgrade community facilities through the Commonwealth Local Roads and Community Infrastructure program which also has meant funding for road improvements and upgrading footpaths in Maryborough.

Support for tourism and hospitality operators has been available through a Victorian Government outdoor dining grant program which has seen Council work with traders to establish attractive, new outdoor 'parklet' dining areas.

To pave the way for the increasing number of visitors using electric cars we now have a charging station at the rear of the Community Hub as part of a regional Victorian Government program.

A key heritage feature in Princes Park is the iconic Grandstand. Council has commissioned a Cultural Management Plan to ensure its preservation well into the future and to share its rich stories.

Maryborough Railway Station is the jewel in a rich crown. Council intends for it to be a major cultural and tourism hub for the region and a first step towards that was the recent relocation of the Visitor Information Centre to the Station creating a wonderful visitor facility. An attractive co-working space for new business operators will provide important support. Council appreciates the funding contribution from the Victorian Government. We have very big plans for the future of the Station.

Enjoy the wide range of news and updates we bring to you in this edition. It was great to get so much positive feedback on how valued this publication is.

2021/22 PROPOSED BUDGET

We're currently inviting our community to review and provide feedback on the 2021/22 Proposed Council Budget. Its main focus is to implement the key objectives of the 2017-2021 Council Plan and deliver on our commitment to deliver more than 40 services to our community.

Council has been successful in attracting in excess of \$10 million in grant funding. Together with Council funding, the Capital Works Program will exceed \$18 million. These projects will not only provide a boost to local facilities but also a stimulus to the local economy in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic.

A rate rise of 1.5% in line with the Victorian Government determined rate cap is also proposed.

RECONCILIATION **ACTION PLAN**

The development of Council's first Reconciliation Action Plan is underway.

Our Reconciliation Officer Georgia MacGuire has been running Reconciliation Vision workshops with Councillors and staff.

This has included learning about the core values and the five dimensions of Reconciliation: Historical Acceptance; Race Relations; Equality and Equity; Institutional Integrity: and Unity.

The focus of the workshops has been to develop a Council vision for Reconciliation, which will be included in the Plan.

Once developed, Council will establish a Reconciliation Working Group which will include First Nations community representatives.

THANK YOU!

Between December, 2020 and January, 2021 we invited community feedback on our Draft Communications and Engagement Strategy and Draft Community Engagement Policy.

Thank you to the 100 plus residents who contributed via listening posts, surveys and written submissions - the feedback you shared helped us gain four key insights:

- The biggest barrier to participation is a lack of trust in Council's ability to listen and learn.
- Our community is diverse so communication needs to be targeted.
- Our community is diverse so there is no one size fits all approach to engagement.
- Our community wants transparency from Council.

Changes were made to both documents in response to this feedback.

The updated Community Engagement Policy was adopted at the February Council Meeting and the updated Communications and Engagement Strategy was adopted at the April Council Meeting.

CHANGES TO CENTRAL GOLDFIELDS WASTE AND RECYCLING SYSTEM

In order to provide a consistent, state-wide approach to waste, the Victorian Government has introduced state-wide reforms to Victoria's recycling system. This means, later this year, Central Goldfields Shire will move to a new four-stream waste and recycling system.

The roll-out involves:

RED BIN General Waste (rubbish) NO CHANGE



GREEN BIN

Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO)

FOGO will continue as an opt-in service for residents across the municipality.

The only change to this service is that residents (with a green bin) can place their food waste in this bin with their garden organics waste.

This waste will continue to go to Council's compositing facility at the Carisbrook Transfer Station where it is made available to residents who are signed up to the composting service.



PURPLE CALICO BAGS Glass collection

In line with Victorian Government requirements councils must commence behaviour change towards separating glass from the yellow bin to make it "habit" by 2027. More information will be communicated over the coming months.

Council is working towards providing all residents with a purple calico bag (like shopping bags) to put their glass into by the end of the year. Glass can be placed in these bags and taken to central and convenient local collection points (locations to be confirmed) or at our three Transfer Stations at Carisbrook, Dunolly and Talbot. Council will engage with the community around additional collection point locations in the coming months.

Whilst encouraged, taking your glass to a collection point location is not mandatory until 2027.

The changes to waste and recycling are in line with Council's 2020-2030 Waste Management Strategy that was adopted by Council in 2020.

In the conversations we had with our community in the development of this Strategy – reducing waste to landfill was important to our residents.

YELLOW BIN Recycling

Paper, cardboard and other plastics will continue to be placed in the yellow recycling bin. As we work towards meeting the requirement for all Victorians to separate glass from their other recycling materials, Council is encouraging residents to start separating glass from the yellow bin so that we can make it a 'habit' by 2027.

This glass will then be turned into a reusable product that Council will used for local road projects.

The annual fee for Council's opt-in FOGO system is \$73.20. Residents who sign up receive a 240 litre green bin that is collected on the first and third Friday of every month.

There will be no change to residents currently signed up for the opt-in service.

CURRENT **PROJECTS** CAPITAL WORKS

CARISBROOK LEVEE

• **Project schedule:** Ongoing

The Carisbrook Levee project was designed by specialists Entura in response to major floods which occurred in 2010 and 2011.

The project is being delivered in four stages - one and two are complete, stage three is nearing completion and stage four is subject to Federal Government funding.

Stage 3 - Current

Construction of Stage 3 of the Carisbrook Levee commenced on 12 October. 2020.

Local company Doran Earthmoving Pty Ltd delivered a section of the project that included the construction of the Levee - the section of Pleasant Street from the Pyrenees Highway to the railway line and High Street from the railway line to Church Street.

The works involved building up, and constructing a sealed road and associated open drainage works.

The works associated with the railway line include the installation of drainage culverts, which approvals are currently being obtained.

The tender for the next part of stage three of the Carisbrook Levee project closed on 7 April, 2021.

The tender, titled Pyrenees Highway, Carisbrook - Culvert construction, is for the installation of the drainage culverts under the Pyrenees Highway.

This part of the project will see the installation of twin cell box culverts – 1200mm high by 1200mm – across the Pyrenees Highway located to the west of Pleasant Street, Carisbrook. The culverts will redirect the overland flows along the levee when the southern section of the levee is completed. To allow for the installation of the culverts existing utility services will be relocated in the coming months.

ENERGY BREAKTHROUGH **ENHANCEMENT PROJECT**

- **Project value:** \$1.5 million from Victorian Government
- **Project schedule:** Due for completion by November, 2022

The Maryborough Energy Breakthrough Project will encompass a range of enhancements to the festival site, racing conditions and the visitor experience including: expanded scope and technology focus; enhanced spectator experience; improved camping facilities; increased interactivity; and improved safety.

Phase Two of the project will broaden the reach of the event, attracting new start-ups and established technology and utilities companies to create a world class future-skills focused STEM Expo as part of the event.



CENTRAL GOLDFIELDS ART GALLERY REDEVELOPMENT

- Project value: \$1.7 million from Victorian Government and \$273,000 from Council's 2020/21 Budget
- Project schedule: Commencing in October, 2021 with completion expected by May, 2022

In March, the Victorian Government announced an additional \$1.2 million in funding for phases 2 and 3 of the Central Goldfields Art Gallery redevelopment project.

This is additional funding to the \$500,000 announced last year and will see the project now delivered in its entirety.

Identified as one of Council's Priority Projects and a transformational project in the Central Goldfields Shire Tourism and Events Strategy, the redevelopment includes: refurbishment and extension, including opening the original fire doors at the front of the Gallery; increased exhibition spaces; installation of improved environmental and climate controls; remodelling of internal Gallery spaces; improved storage facilities for the Shire's art collection; creation of an open contemporary reception; improved accessibility and visitor services amenities; and external landscaping including the installation of an Indigenous Interpretive Garden.

MARYBOROUGH SKATE AND **SCOOTER PARK**

- Project value: \$643,260 project \$250,000 from Victorian Government and \$393,260 from Council
- Project schedule: Construction to begin July, 2021 with completion by August, 2021
- Contractor name: Grind Projects

Maryborough will soon be home to a Skate and Scooter Park with works to commence in July, 2021.

The new facility will be located along Lake Road, Maryborough, in Princes Park near Lake Victoria and the adventure playground and barbecue area.

The Maryborough Skate and Scooter Park was identified as a Priority Project for Council in 2018 after more than 1,000 young people signed a petition and presented it to Council.

Throughout 2019 and 2020, Council held several information and community engagement sessions to determine the Skate and Scooter Park's design and its preferred location.

Council engaged with skate park design and construction experts Convic who facilitated design sessions with community members.

CARISBROOK RECREATION **RESERVE UPGRADE**

- Project value: In October 2018 the Victorian Government allocated \$2 million for stage one of the project. A further \$2,157,900 was announced in August, 2020 for stage two. Council has committed to providing \$118,000 towards Stage 1 and \$220,000 towards Stage 2, a total of \$338,000.
- Project schedule: The project will be delivered in five stages. Stage One has commenced with completion expected by the end of August, 2021.

Identified as one of Council's Priority Projects, this community led project will create an accessible and inclusive modern sporting facility and community hub for the growing population of Carisbrook and surrounding townships. The upgraded facility aims to get more people, more active, more often and will provide the Carisbrook community with more opportunities to stage events, classes and gatherings.

The project will deliver the following:

- Stage One: Early Works car parking, new vehicle entry, removal of away change rooms and a new green keepers shed
- **Stage Two:** Upgrades to the existing netball and tennis courts – court resurfacing and line-marking
- Stage Three: Additional bowls club enhancement works
- Stage Four: New additions to existing pavilion including - female friendly player and umpire change rooms and amenities, two netball change rooms and amenities, a new netball show court with lighting, multi-purpose room for events and meetings, first aid rooms, office space, feeding room, disabled car space, ramps and viewing platform.
- **Stage Five:** A bowls/community pavilion with a toilet block – a new pavilion to service bowling greens and community events, social room for events and meetings, kitchen, pavilion and public toilets and disabled car space, ramps and viewing platform

MARYBOROUGH OUTDOOR **POOL UPGRADE**

- **Project value:** \$2 million from Victorian Government
- **Project schedule:** The majority of the project is expected to be complete by early 2022.

In May, 2020 the Victorian Government announced \$2 million in urgent works for the heritage-listed Maryborough Outdoor Pool.

The Maryborough Municipal Olympic Complex Conservation Management Plan was adopted by Council in May, 2018. The Plan provided Council with a detailed assessment of the complex and recommendations for a staged plan for work and outlined \$2 million in priority works.

In May last year the Victorian Government announced \$2 million in funding which will see the delivery of the urgent works for the heritage-listed facility.

The project will include maintenance works to the 50m pool, octagonal pool, filter and plant room and entrance pavilion.

DUNOLLY LIBRARY

- Project Value: \$140,000 from Victorian Government Living Libraries Grant announced in December 2019.
- Project schedule: Due for completion by May, 2021.
- Contractor name: FNG Group Pty Ltd.

The former Police station building in Dunolly – located in the Dunolly Courthouse precinct on Market Street – is the location for the new Dunolly Library facility.

The project involves the re-stumping of the existing building, construction of an accessible toilet, ramp, new shelving, fresh paint, new carpet and air-conditioning.

The new facility will replace the visiting outreach service and will feature a larger collection of resources, services and activities, public access computer, free WiFi and additional children's programming.

MARYBOROUGH REGIONAL LIBRARY UPGRADE

- Project value: \$145,000 from Victorian Government Living Libraries Grant.
- Project schedule: To be confirmed

In April, 2021 the Victorian Government announced funding that will see the Maryborough Library refurbished and modernised with a new circulation desk and flexible shelving. Fresh paint and carpet will also be delivered as part of the project.

The upgrade will create more room for popular services including children's programming, school holiday events and senior's activities.

PRINCES PARK GRANDSTAND CULTURAL MANAGEMENT PLAN

We're currently developing a Cultural Management Plan for the Princes Park Grandstand in Maryborough so it can be preserved for future generations.

The Plan will provide Council with a detailed assessment of the Princes Park Grandstand to develop an affordable, staged plan of works to restore and conserve the historic recreation facility for the future.

The Draft Plan will be made available for the community to review and provide feedback in May with the final version expected to go to Council in June.

A NEW HOME FOR THE VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE

As part of the Central Goldfields Shire vision to put tourism front-and-centre of the region's economic development, the Central Goldfields Visitor Information Centre is now located at the iconic Maryborough Railway Station.

The move – brought about by tourism and business community feedback during the development of the Economic Development and Tourism strategies – features a larger floorplan, expanded car parking as well as capacity for caravans.

CENTRAL GOLDFIELDS CO-WORKING SPACE OPENS

Are you a business start-up, community group, or individual looking for a space to work away from home? The newly opened Central Goldfields Co-Working Space at the Maryborough Railway Station could be the perfect option!

Located in the north side of the Maryborough Railway Station building, the Space comes fully equipped with a meeting table, high speed internet, printing/photocopying/scanning, 3D printing, video conferencing, secure lockers and a kitchenette.

The Co-Working Space offers users the flexibility of hiring a desk or co-working space for a day or several days across a defined period.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

CHARGED UP AND READY TO GO!

An Electric Vehicle Charging Station was officially opened in February at the Community Hub in Maryborough.

The first of 17 sites across the region, the project was funded by the Victorian Government 'Charging the Regions' project, led by Central Victorian Greenhouse Alliance and delivered in partnership with 11 neighbouring councils.



DUNOLLY TOURISM GETS A BOOST

In a boost to local tourism, a public dump point will soon be established in Dunolly. The Dunolly Caravan Park's dump point – with public access via Maude Street – will be made available for public use after consultation between the park's operators, the community and Council.

The partnership between Council and the Dunolly Caravan Park was endorsed by Councillors at the March Council Meeting – with acknowledgement to the Dunolly and District Inc for their ongoing commitment to having a public dump point locally.

A NEW ERA IN OUTDOOR DINING

A series of new outdoor 'parklet' dining areas have popped up across the Shire over the past few months.

The Daily Dose Café Wine Bar in High Street, Maryborough was the first to open in February (pictured above), with additional parklets installed in Dunolly during March and April.

The parklets offer an extension of the footpath that allows additional space for pedestrians or businesses to use the street.

Thanks to a partnership with the Maryborough Education Centre, a series of planter boxes will be added to streetscapes in Maryborough and Dunolly.

Students and staff from MEC are building the planter boxes – with many students across different years and skill levels contributing in different ways to the project.

Both projects have been made possible with funding from the Victorian Government's Outdoor Eating and Entertainment Package aimed at supporting the hospitality industry to rebuild from the economic and social impacts of the pandemic.

The project is also an outcome of the consultation Council undertook with the business community in 2020 as part of the Jump Start program.

With all components of the parklet purchased or made in our own municipality, it's an initiative that has seen funding dollars go straight back in the local economy.

GO GOLDFIELDS HAS A NEW HQ

The Maryborough Resource Centre on Alma Street in Maryborough (adjoining the Maryborough Regional Library) is now home to the Go Goldfields Partnership.

With the Visitor Information Centre moving to its new relocation at the Maryborough Railway Station, Go Goldfields is set to re-energise and re-purpose the space as part of a pop-up trial starting this month.

The new location will feature a collaboration space for community members, service providers, and collaborative partners to come together and work as well as Nurture and Engagement space providing a safe, welcoming, and inspiring place for parents, carers, children, and family support workers.

EVERY CHILD, EVERY CHANCE

Every Child, Every Chance is a Go Goldfields initiative uniting our community to ensure that children in the Central Goldfields Shire are safe, healthy, and confident. The initiative is focused on five Priority Areas:

- Healthy and Supported Pregnancies;
- Confident and Connected New Parents;
- Safe and Secure Children;

FUNDING FOR PHILLIPS GARDENS

In February, Council received \$150,000 in funding from the Victorian Government's Growing Victoria's Botanic Gardens grants program.

The funding will be used to upgrade the existing irrigation system in Phillips Gardens to a central control system.

This will make irrigating the gardens more sustainable and irrigation will reach areas not currently irrigated.

GOLDFIELDS RESERVOIR WATER LEVELS REPLENISHED

In February, Council partnered with Central Highlands Water to replenish the water levels at the Goldfields Reservoir in Maryborough.

The water was pumped from Central Highlands Water's available groundwater resources and was released to a channel that flows into the Goldfields Reservoir.

GORDON GARDENS MASTER PLAN PROJECT

The next stage of the Gordon Gardens Master Plan project is underway in Dunolly and includes:

- Extension of the ramps into the Senior Citizens building
- Walking path from the car park to the Queen Victoria Jubilee Monument within Gordon Gardens
- New path and new pedestrian gate into the Bowls Club from the car park
- New sliding gate at the Bowls Club to allow access to the Bowls Club sheds
- Relocation of the Bowls Club's water tanks

The works are being delivered by Council's Operations team and are expected to be complete late May, 2021 (weather permitting). The works follow the construction of a basketball court, bicycle/scooter pump track, outdoor fitness equipment/ shade structure and a touch-free water fountain in 2020/2021.

The Gordon Gardens Master Plan was adopted in September, 2019.

UP IN LIGHTS

New lighting has been installed in the car park at the Maryborough Community House. The lighting, aimed at improving community safety, was funded by the Victorian Government Community Crime Prevention Program.



DERBY ROAD ENHANCEMENT PROJECT

Works are about to commence to beautify the median strip along Derby Road, Maryborough – between Lean Street (Goldfields Reservoir) and Carramar Nursery.

As one of Maryborough's main entry points, the project will make this precinct more visually pleasing to visitors and complement the median strips located at the High Street end of Derby Road.

The project involves the planting of 30 Japanese Elm trees, with Tuscan stone filling the space between the trees. Irrigation will also be installed as part of the project.

The project, funded as part of the Council's 2020/21 Budget, will take around two weeks to complete and is expected to be carried out in May.

ENSURING FOOD SAFETY IN THE CENTRAL GOLDFIELDS

Did you know Council is required to monitor local food businesses to ensure they comply with food safety requirements and legislation? This includes registration and inspection of food businesses as well as issuing permits for temporary food premises and stalls. Council also investigates complaints and concerns regarding food premises.

As part of this Council's Environmental Health Officer has commenced their annual inspection process. This involves in-person visits to the 128 registered food premises – cafés and restaurants - in the Shire, to carry out an inspection for compliance.

The inspection involves assessing compliance from when ingredients are purchased to when the ingredients are turned into a meal and served to a customer.
