Both these buildings are very special and it is wonderful to be part of the transformation journey for each, as they are developed for expanded opportunities and to showcase their offerings in improved and enhanced ways.

Our future focus in this edition also includes a feature on the wide range of Council's youth activities. Council was thrilled to receive funding from the Victorian Government to enable the establishment of a Youth Council and we are keen to hear what direction our youth want to take for this.

Climate Action is of course part of planning for our future and we discuss the important work of our Climate Action Collaboration Group.

Covid has reminded us all of the importance of keeping safe and healthy and Council is thrilled with our new look Immunisation Service which we share with you.

support to deliver activities, programs, small events, equipment and infrastructure. Applications are open now and close on Monday 13 June, 2022.






GALLERY INDIGENOUS INTERPRETATIVE GARDEN

Council is delighted to have approved designs for the Indigenous Interpretive Garden that will form part of the Central Goldfields Art Gallery redevelopment.

These designs were developed through an Indigenist Wartaka process to ensure Dja Dja Wurrung people led the development of the cultural themes embedded within the design. The workshops focused on creating space for storytelling, conceptual mapping and also visioning to ensure the integral values of respect, recognition and reconciliation. This process was facilitated by the Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation (DDWCAC) and supported by Landscape Architects, 3Acres. Stage 1 of the Garden will be delivered as part of the current construction, with funding for Stage 2 & 3 currently being sought through the Priority Projects Plan.

MARYBOROUGH RAILWAY STATION ACTIVATION PROJECT

A vision to transform the Maryborough Railway Station into a vibrant visitor hub is well underway.

Building on initial improvement works to the Station completed in March 2021, this project will transform Maryborough Railway Station into a visitor and activity hub that will accommodate a mix of tourism, commercial transport and community uses.

Project elements include installation of digital infrastructure and interpretive experiences, upgrades to the café and visitor information centre sites, provision of creative studio spaces and improvements to the accessibility, landscaping and parking functions of the Station.

Stage Two of the project is jointly funded with \$1.8 million from the Victorian Government's Stronger Regional Communities Program and \$200,000 from Council.



FLYNN WARD NEWS

A lot of great things are happening in Flynn Ward.

Dunolly has recently seen a couple of new committees starting up: The Dunolly Traders Inc. is a group of local shop keepers and businesses and they have hit the ground running. Some great initiatives and projects are being planned by this committee that has enthusiasm and drive by the bucket full.

The Dunolly Car Club is another recent addition to the town with an excellent display of cars at the Australia Day Celebration by its members.

The Dunolly and District Incorporated (DDI) are busy planning the Dunolly Gold Rush Festival, to be held on the third weekend in October 2022. The Gold Rush Festival first appeared in 1971 and ran for many years before petering out. The DDI has decided that it is time to see if they can get this festival up and running again to promote tourism to the town.

Bealiba has also seen a bit of a resurgence with a Community Day held recently. A group of local residents representing various community groups, came together and planned a 'Free Sausage Sizzle' lunch at the town hall for all residents. The day was a huge success, with around 50 people attending. Hopefully a new Bealiba Community Committee will be set up soon to keep this great little towns' spirit thriving.

DELEDIO RECREATION RESERVE

The Deledio Recreation Reserve Master Plan 2011-2020 identified a new pavilion as a high priority after it was determined that the building was not suitable for an upgrade but needed to be replaced.

In April 2020 Avor Architecture were appointed to develop the concept plans and costings – which were funded by Council.

With these concept plans finalised, funding is now required to deliver the project.

Council will continue to work with local groups to investigate funding options and provide support for grant applications for the detailed planning and construction of the new Deledio Pavilion.

The project is also one of 14 projects in Council's Priority Projects Plan – see page 5 for details.

"Since becoming Flynn Ward Councillor I have attended the Dunolly Recreation Reserve Committee of Management Inc. meetings and I'm proud of this small but enthusiastic group of volunteers who have worked tirelessly for many, many years to bring the new Deledio Pavilion to reality. MAIN STREET UPGRADE

The \$380,000 upgrade to Main Street in Bealiba is now underway. The project is funded by the Federal Government's Roads to Recovery Program.

PLAYGROUND FENCE COMPLETE

In response to community feedback, a fence has been installed around the Gordon Gardens playground in Dunolly. The project has been funded through the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.







TULLAROOP WARD NEWS

Tullaroop Ward is a Ward with many facets and feels, in some ways like a microcosm with many different groups. The Community Township Plans that were developed in 2019 played a huge role in guiding and directing me during the first months as Councillor. Investigating and re-visiting the existing Community Township Plans resulted in the development of the Carisbrook Community Conversations. I am a great believer in the importance of communication, the exchange of ideas and information and building relationships.

An Officer's Report was presented to Council in September 2021 naming two key priorities as identified by members of the public. The Creek was identified as playing a significant role within the community and the importance of continued development to be used as a space for community activity. The Carisbrook Town Hall was identified as a significant asset and much valued by the community. The establishment of a Community Asset Committee managing the Town Hall was highlighted. These two topics were on the agenda for the Community Conversation held in March 2022.

LEVEE MOVES TO FINAL STAGE

In March, the tender for Stage Four, the final stage of the Carisbrook Levee project was awarded to local business – Doran Earthmoving – following a public tender process. The project is jointly funded by Federal and State governments and Council. For more information visit www.engage.cgoldshire.vic.gov.au/carisbrooklevee

Stage One – completed early 2017

- Pleasant Street Levee construction (north of the railway line)
- Drainage works along Wills Street and within the racecourse.

Stage Two – completed 2017

 Williams Road Levee construction (West – East running levee, which continues east from Williams Rd across Landrigan Rd towards the Tullaroop Creek).

Stage Three – completed 2021

- Pleasant Street Levee construction from the Pyrenees Highway to the railway line and High Street from the railway line to Church Street.
- Installation of twin cell box culverts across the Pyrenees Highway (located to the west of Pleasant Street, Carisbrook).

Stage Four (final stage) - funded

- Stage Four tender awarded to local business Doran Earthmoving in March
- Completion expected in November, 2022.
- Western Levee construction south of Pyrenees Highway
- Construction of 1,500 metre earthen levee bank and open drainage

RECREATION RESERVE UPGRADE

Stage One and Two of the \$4.9 million Carisbrook Recreation Reserve upgrade are now complete, with stages three and four now underway. The project is jointly funded by the Victorian Government and Council.

MARYBOROUGH WARD NEWS

There has been a flurry of work happening around the Shire over the past few months.

Those specific to Maryborough are most notably the upgrades to the Art Gallery which when finished will increase our capacity to attract an exciting program of new exhibitions.

Roadworks have begun at the corner Nightingale and Clarendon Street. The transformation of this intersection will improve the safety of the intersection.

Ten new lights have been installed in Princes Park along paths linking Lake Victoria, as well as upgrading the existing 27 lights bringing better visibility and safety – especially as the days get shorter over the winter months. There has been some terrific work in the youth section with Engage and FReeZa programs. They are working the establishment of a Youth Council as well as a LGBTIQA+ support group. There is also some initial exciting work going toward a Central Goldfields Pride Festival together with Mill House that aims to build confidence and connectedness within our younger community.

SUPPORTING OUR HOSPITALITY BUSINESSES



PADDY'S RANGES WARD NEWS

Community and town halls have been a big focus in Paddy's Ranges Ward and its been great to work with committees of management to identify and fund their priorities through funding provided by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

This Program has enabled exterior painting and maintenance, kitchen and floor stabilisation, running hot water and air conditioning at Wareek Hall; new paving, upgraded electrical work and kitchen plumbing at Adelaide Lead Hall; a water tank for fire safety, landscaping, paving and playground enhancement at Daisy Hill Hall; air conditioning and plumbing works at Bowenvale Hall and the demolition of the existing Talbot Town Hall toilets with a new construction commencing.

Talbot Market Square redesign; beautification of Talbot Soldier's Memorial Park; enhancements to Amherst and Bung Bong Cemeteries and the exterior refurbishment of the Old Dunach School in Talbot Museum are other exciting changes.

MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

With the introduction of a new home for Immunisation there will be some changes to Council's Maternal and Child Health Service.

Maternal and Child Health will no longer offer infant/childhood immunisations during their key age and stage visits and instead families will be able to make a dedicated appointment through the Immunisation Service.

This means families can spend more time talking with their Maternal and Child Health nurse about their child's growth and development, and family's wellbeing.

The woven basket will be on display at Central Goldfields Art Gallery when the Gallery is scheduled for reopening later this year after a major redevelopment. Aunty Marilyne envisaged the basket in the form of a nest. She used tight spiral binding on the base of the basket. The spiral is representative of the Bunjil Creation story and unfolds in the flightpath that Bunjil the spirit eagle flies in the sky.

On the outside of the basket Aunty Marilyne has used open coil weaving skill technique. This style of weaving allows light to come through and the artist has intentionally chosen this technique as a symbolic way of allowing space for pathways and corridors to create change and new possibilities. Around the edge of the basket is a white ochre band and bundles of emu feathers which are traditional elements of a women's basket.



NAVIGATING THE BUILDING AND PLANNING PERMIT PROCESS



Applying for a building or planning permit can be confusing and often it is difficult to navigate the many rules and requirements.

Whether building a farm shed, your dream home or simply adding a deck, you should always check with Council to see what the requirements are and whether you need to obtain a building and/or planning permit.

The difference

In simple terms, planning permits decide what can be built on your land, while building permits decide how that work will take place. Planning permits are always dealt with by Council whereas building permits can be issued by Private Building Surveyors.

WHERE TO START?

Planning permits

For planning permits, you need to contact Council. If you are considering buying land, it can often be tempting to take at face value what the real estate advert says or to simply trust the views of agents, vendors and neighbours. Whilst they certainly have plenty of knowledge and are terrific resources, our Planning team will give you unbiased, factual information and we urge you to use them as early in the process as possible.

Building permits

When it comes to building permits, this can be a little trickier. Do you speak to Council, a builder or a private surveyor? The Council building team has had staff shortages in recent times, and other regional councils have also been tackling this problem. However, starting with us for general information is a good first step. Once you have identified the requirements you can then look to private surveyors. Council can provide you with a list of local qualified building surveyors to get you started.

The gift of time

If you can, allow yourself enough time to go through the process. Due to its very nature, planning and building will always be changing, as it is largely dictated by the State Government and not always within Council's control.

We offer 24/7 returns, Click and Collect service, and if you can't make it in – we offer a free housebound delivery service where we bring the library to you!

Fast Facts: There are 18,150 items available to access as part of the Library collection! During March this year: **3,000** people visited our libraries **4,000** items were circulated **1,233** items were ordered that patrons requested. Taking the Library to you! If you are experiencing illness, injury or have transport issues we bring the Library to you as part of our free, monthly, Housebound Delivery Service.

The service also visits aged care residents at Raglan House and Havilah on a monthly basis!
