Volunteering in Australia: A Snapshot

In 2023, the Federal Government released the National Strategy for Volunteering. It identified:

- 56.7% of Australians volunteer either formally or informally
- 83% of volunteer involving organisations need more volunteers
- The rate of volunteering has been gradually **declining** from 1/3 adults in 2010 to 1/4 in 2022.
- A significant **mismatch** exists between the volunteering opportunities being offered and what volunteers are interested in.

In July last year, we invited our community to participate in a survey to better understand what volunteers need.

Thank you to the 75 residents who took the time to share their thoughts.

You told us there was a need to:

- Talk about volunteering in a new way
- Make it easy for people of all backgrounds and ages to get involved
- Help people who are at risk of social isolation to benefit from volunteering experiences
- Focus on creating a great experience for volunteers
- Provide support and guidance to groups to adapt to changing expectations of volunteers

INDIGENOUS INTERPRETIVE GARDEN

Construction of the new Indigenous Interpretive Garden is now underway.

A new Indigenous Interpretive Garden is currently being constructed in the open space on the corner of Neill and Campbell streets, Maryborough – just next to Central Goldfields Art Gallery.

Jointly funded by the Victorian Government and Council, the Garden will be a public place inviting the whole community to come together in a spirit of reconciliation to understand and celebrate culture.

The Garden has been designed collaboratively with Djaara elders and artists through a Wartaka process, with Dja Dja Wurrung elders and artists to weave their story and reflect natural elements of Djaara country in an inspiring way.

Once complete, the Indigenous Interpretive Garden will be accessible via the Gallery and a separate street entrance. The project is expected to be complete mid-2024.

MAJOR PROJECTS



Octagonal Pool rebuild takes shape

Whilst we await news of our application to the Federal Government's Growing Regions Program for the funding needed to restore the heritage listed Maryborough Outdoor Pool precinct, work continues on the Octagonal Pool.

The project to re-build the Octagonal Pool commenced in 2023 and is on track for completion mid-year.

The project involves the construction of an entirely new pool shell, recovery of as many of the original tiles as possible and repairs to the concourse.

New tiles for the indoor pool

The 25-metre indoor pool at the Maryborough Sports and Leisure Centre is now closed to make way for an upgrade.

The current pool tiles are almost 25 years old and are at the end of their life. They'll be replaced, along with the tiles surrounding the pool concourse, so that the pool can be enjoyed for many more years to come.

To ensure our community has access to aquatic facilities for as long as possible, the outdoor pool season will be extended at both the Talbot and Dunolly pools until Monday 1 April.

The upgrade to the 25-metre pool is expected to be complete late May.

NETBALL COURTS FOR DELEDIO

Since early 2023 we've been working in partnership with the Dunolly Football Netball Club to design and deliver a new netball court and a multi-use tennis and netball court and lighting at Deledio Reserve.

The project commenced in December but was stalled in mid-January due to wet weather.

Council Officers have been working closely with contractors to make up for lost time on the project, and it is continuing full steam ahead. With solid foundations in place, contractors will work on laying concrete and acrylic surfacing, as well as the installation of light poles, shelters and other supporting elements in March.

The project is jointly funded by the Victorian Government and Council.

New toilets at Rene Fox Gardens

The upgrade to the Rene Fox Gardens public toilet facilities has moved a step closer.

We now have Heritage Victoria approval and the contract for the works is expected to be awarded late March. *The project is fully funded by Council.*

AN ADVISORY GROUP FOR TULLAROOP CREEK

In 2021 – with the help of the local community – we developed a Waterway Management Plan for Carisbrook.

The purpose of the Plan was to identify priorities for the future management of the Tullaroop Creek and the two public reserve areas – Bucknall and Bland Reserves.

The Plan recommended that an advisory group be created to support its delivery.

This is an opportunity for interested community members to be part of a group that will provide advice and guidance to Council on the management, development and maintenance of Tullaroop Creek over the next two years.

We saw the completion of stage 4 of the levee in Carisbrook. The Community Asset Committee for Tullaroop Leisure Centre was confirmed at the December 2023 Ordinary Council Meeting.

Thanks to the amazing effort of our Flood Recovery Officer appointed in 2023, a lot of work has been done and a range of ideas have been suggested to support the flood-affected community in Carisbrook. The main focus is the continued development of resilience in Carisbrook.

PLAN FOR EMERGENCIES AT HOME

The fire events during February are a reminder to all of us of the importance of being prepared for an emergency situation.

Experience shows that those who plan and prepare for emergencies can reduce the impact of the emergency and can recover quickly afterwards.

Emergencies can happen anywhere, at any time. It's important to have a plan, know what to do and where to find information in an emergency.

Here is some information that will help you get started – as well as a series of websites and phone numbers where you can find additional information and support.

Warning levels

There are three different levels of warning:

Emergency warning



Warning (Watch and Act)

• An emergency is developing nearby. You need to take action now to protect yourself and others.

Advice

- An incident is occurring or has occurred in the area. Access information and monitor conditions.
- Can also be used as a notification that activity in the area has subsided and is no longer a danger to you.

Additional messages

Additional messages that may be issued are:

Evacuation

An evacuation is recommended or procedures are in place to evacuate.

Community update

Specific information and updates for affected communities regarding a particular event or incident.

Prepare

It's important to have an emergency plan so you know how to prepare yourself & your home in the event of a flood, fire or other emergency. For more information on how to prepare visit the Australian Red Cross website: www.redcross.org.au/emergencies/

In an emergency

The vaccine is free for children aged six months to five years, people with chronic medical conditions, pregnant women, and those over 65 years. If you aren't eligible for a free vaccine, the cost is \$16.10.

Council to move to single-councillor wards

Central Goldfields Shire Council will move to a single-councillor ward structure for the 2024 Council Election.

The change is the result of the Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) electoral structure review, which takes place every 12 years.

Currently, our municipality is divided into four wards with a total of 7 Councillors – one ward with four Councillors (Maryborough Ward) and three wards with one Councillor each (Flynn, Paddys Ranges and Tullaroop).

The electoral structure will move to a single-councillor ward structure with a total of 7 councillors across 7 wards – with one councillor per ward before the October 2024 local government general election. The wards will be titled:

Flynn Ward, Maryborough Central Ward, Maryborough East Ward, Maryborough North Ward, Maryborough West Ward, Paddys Ranges Ward, and Tullaroop Ward.
