As we start to look to Spring – a time of growth and development – I wish first to reflect on what we've accomplished together these past few months.

I was thrilled that the 2023-24 Council Budget adopted at the June meeting continues to deliver 40-plus services and an exciting \$18.5 million plus Capital Works budget (including \$12.3 million in grant funding) that will stimulate our local economy and result in some fantastic community facilities and assets.

On behalf of Council, I wanted to share our appreciation to community members who have taken the time to attend in-person and online community information sessions and provide input – your time and thoughts are truly valued. It is because of this joint effort that many of the stories in this edition highlight completed projects and upgrades.

We are also now enjoying first-hand the upgrades to the Carisbrook Recreation Reserve which will be officially opened in August.

I know many of you are looking forward to seeing our roads and infrastructure restored following last year's floods. An independent assessor found we required \$9.8+ million of repairs to restore damaged roads, culverts, and other public infrastructure within our Shire. I'm pleased to say road upgrades are now well underway.

Soon we will be able to announce the recipients of the Community Grants program. In a new initiative, an additional category was introduced for projects that address the impacts of climate change.

Thank you to everyone who provided feedback on how we can better serve you via this magazine. We've taken what you've shared and made changes to this edition.

I hope you enjoy as my fellow Councillors take you behind the scenes of their work, what they're passionate about and how they advocate for their community.

If we continue working together genuinely as a community partnership, we will indeed achieve the vision we have for our communities.

The local bowling community will be able to enjoy their new facilities when the bowls season kicks off later in the year.

The project was jointly funded by the Victorian Government and Council and has delivered an accessible and inclusive modern sporting facility and community hub for the growing population of Carisbrook and the surrounding district.

The project also included the delivery of a new bowls pavilion with publicly accessible toilets and a newly constructed competition-grade netball court.

At the time of going to print, the official opening of the Reserve was due to be held on Saturday, 5 August 2023 at 12noon.

The review was based on feedback provided by the community through conversations with local leaders and groups in Bealiba, Bet Bet, Carisbrook, Dunolly, Majorca, Maryborough, Talbot and Timor as well as the 'Let's Get Better at Community Planning' workshop held in May.

It identified that our next steps fall into three key areas: small triumphs, building a partnership model and funding a Community Development Officer role to support this work.

Council will recruit for the Community Development Officer position in September.

We've been working in partnership with the Dunolly Football Netball Club to finalise detailed designs for a new netball court and a multi-use tennis/netball court and lighting at Deledio Reserve.

The courts will be a welcome addition to the reserve, with the club operating from a single netball court that requires upgrading. Their second court on site is no longer playable.

The courts have been made possible thanks to \$727,707 from the Victorian Government and \$242,569 from Council.

The project is almost ready to appoint contractors to complete the work, with construction anticipated to be completed by March 2024.

We are currently waiting for Heritage Victoria's approval before the project can progress to appointing contractors to complete the work.



As part of the Victorian Government's Healthy Loddon Campaspe and Healthy Kids Advisor initiative, we have been working with the Dunolly and Carisbrook Football and Netball Clubs, and the Maryborough Giants, to support local clubs to offer healthy food options at their canteens.

The Healthy Sports Clubs initiative has provided both the Dunolly and Carisbrook Football and Netball Clubs with:

- New menu boards and signage that highlight healthier food and drink options.
- Small-scale kitchen equipment such as sandwich presses, display fridges, slow cookers, and air fryers to enable healthy food preparation.
- Resources include healthy recipes, case study videos, fridge set-up guidelines, and preparation and promotion tips for providing healthy food in a sporting club setting.

Live4Life program supports local youth

Maryborough Education Centre delivered accredited Youth Mental Health First Aid training for teachers and support workers along with Highview College and Council staff recently as part of the Central Goldfields Live4Life program.

Since the commencement of Live4Life Central Goldfields, 29 local adults have received Youth Mental Health First Aid training.

The training helps adults to recognise the signs and symptoms of common mental health problems among young people so that they can identify when a young person may need assistance and provide appropriate support and/or referrals to services.



Suicide is the leading cause of death of young people in Australia, and suicide rates are reportedly 40% higher in rural communities. In 2021, Central Goldfields was chosen to be a Live4Life Community due to the collective efforts of Council, local schools and health organisations who recognised the need for more support for our young people in the Shire.

The failing pavement was recently upgraded, thanks to Sustainability Victoria's Sustainable Infrastructure Fund.

Council was awarded \$70,000 towards the estimated \$140,000 project upgrade and used this opportunity to include a greater volume of recycled content in the reinforced concrete.

Concrete supplier, Hanson, worked with Council to develop a suitable product made from 34% recycled content including 14% glass.

Local quilters share a much-needed embrace

A heart-warming story has emerged from the Golden Textures Contemporary Art Quilt Award – currently on display at the Central Goldfields Art Gallery – with one quilt on display that holds particular significance to the community of Carisbrook.

It is a quilt that represents the determination of a local quilter's group – Deep Creek Stitches – in response to the 2011 flood, to show love and support to their distressed community.

The group committed to a vision; to gift every flood affected household with a handmade quilt – and quite remarkably, they achieved just that.

The group put a call out to quilters from all over Australia and worldwide, seeking donations. The response was extraordinary, with tens of thousands of quilter's blocks streaming in from across the globe, resulting in the making and distribution of over 360 quilts. Since then, they have further gifted over 250 quilts for fundraising, as well as to nursing homes, hospitals, and for families fleeing domestic violence.

We pay tribute to the huge effort required by the group to achieve their goal and thank them for their ongoing generosity as they continue to make and gift quilts to the vulnerable, both locally and in surrounding communities.

In Tullaroop Ward we look forward to celebrating the grand opening of the new facilities at the Carisbrook Recreation Reserve on Saturday 5 August. A state-of-the-art bowls pavilion and new changing rooms for footy and netball. Five star facilities to welcome visiting sporting teams.

The highlight of my year was the conclusion of two well attended grant writing workshops for volunteers. I believe that great volunteering depends on sound financial support. Gone are the days where volunteers had bottomless pockets to support groups and causes they are passionate about.



We know our residents have been patiently waiting to see infrastructure and the road network restored.

Works are currently being delivered by local contractor Shay Excavations and Council's Operations team.

For us to submit a claim to recover the costs of this repair work through the Federal Government's National Disaster Financial Assistance program – we were required to provide a detailed scope of the repair work.

We engaged Shepherd Services - an experienced asset management and impact assessment consultancy firm, to assess the damage and provide a detailed summary of what was needed.

The assessment identified that \$9.8+ million of repairs are needed to restore damaged roads, culverts, and other public infrastructure in our Shire.

Ongoing flood recovery support

In response to the 2022 floods, Council received funding from the Victorian Government to employ a Community Recovery Officer to support our residents in their recovery.

This includes working with all our communities to assist with their specific recovery needs and to consult with flood-affected residents to develop initiatives that strengthen and build capacity in response to the potential for future disasters.

In March, we became aware of termite damage in one of the structural beams at the Princes Park Grandstand and the area was roped off to ensure community safety.

Since then, we've been working with a structural engineer to determine the best way to stabilise the beam. Once the most appropriate solution has been finalised, we will engage a specialist builder to carry out the rectification works.

In addition, Council has allocated \$200,000 in the 2023-2024 Budget to scope and design an upgrade to the Princes Park Grandstand – which will be informed by the Conservation Plan that was developed in 2021.

This will provide us with the detailed planning we need to advocate for the funding required to not only preserve this heritage asset but see it provide fit-for-purpose facilities that meet current standards and make this valued community asset more user-friendly.

The project is made possible thanks to funding through the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program and Council.

Long term, Council will continue to seek funding opportunities that would see us be able to restore the Town Hall to its former glory. Additional funding would allow us to carry out additional upgrade works so that the Hall could be widely used and open more often.

Maryborough Outdoor Pool will remain closed until funding is secured

Council remains committed to seeing the heritage-listed Maryborough Outdoor Pool complex re-opened for community use.

A tender to upgrade the octagonal pool was awarded at the May Council Meeting.

Council awarded a \$1,376,510 contract to SJ Weir Ballarat Pty Ltd to see an entirely new pool shell constructed, recovery of as many of the original tiles as possible and repairs to the concourse.

We continue to work behind the scenes to plan and advocate for the money needed to restore the entire precinct so that it can be re-opened for the community to enjoy.

By offering diverse learning experiences, career advice, and mentors, the Learning Hub will build aspiration and interest in local education, training and work pathways.

In March, 40 local businesses and young people in Maryborough, came together and identified the need to tackle a gap in employment in Central Goldfields Shire with no post-secondary training to support young adults to stay within their communities.



The outcome was the endorsement of a Learning Hub to provide young people with employment opportunities.

In preparation for the Learning Hub, invested stakeholders will run pilot projects to test key program features such as industry tours, afterschool student mentoring, and study spaces.

Co-designing a Learning Hub is a significant milestone for Maryborough and is part of a broader strategy for change facilitated by the Triggering Innovation Leadership Transformation Research and Development group (TILT R&D).

The partnership is between La Trobe University, The Australian National University (ANU), and Fraunhofer IESE, who have provided industry 5.0+ technical support from Germany.

This partnership demonstrates an ongoing commitment to continue supporting Maryborough to build its Learning Hub and other regional innovation projects in the Central Goldfields Shire.

The purpose of the Plan is to provide direction around population growth, future housing demand and areas for infill and greenfield development for Talbot upon the implementation of a reticulated sewerage scheme for the township.

The two core components of the Talbot Futures Project are a town structure plan overseen by Council and an updated and fully costed sewerage scheme plan overseen by Central Highlands Water.
